

ORDINANCE NO. 20-13

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF RICHMOND, KENTUCKY AMENDING
ORDINANCE NO. 76-26 WITH CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF CHAPTER 90 OF THE
CITY OF RICHMOND, KENTUCKY CODE OF ORDINANCES**

WHEREAS, the City currently has Ordinance No. 76-26, supporting the Madison County Animal Shelter; and

WHEREAS, in view of the fiscal constraints imposed upon the City as the result of the health pandemic presently sweeping the country, the Board of Commissioners is required to closely examine City expenditures with an eye towards reducing or eliminating expenses where that can be done so as to allow the City to maintain services essential to City residents; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds that the City expenditures contemplated by Ordinance No. 76-26 represent an expense that can be greatly reduced;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED that:

SECTION I

Section 90.31(D) of the City of Richmond, Kentucky Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

“§ 90.31 IMPOUNDING OF DOGS.

(D) Impoundment shall be at the Madison County Animal Shelter, or any other place which meets the specifications of the humane society and which is officially designated by the ~~Madison County Fiscal Court~~ City of Richmond.”

SECTION II

Section 90.34 of the City of Richmond, Kentucky Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

“§ 90.34 ANIMAL SHELTER; WARDENS.

(A) The animal shelter provided by the Madison County Fiscal Court or such other shelter as may be designated by the City of Richmond is hereby designated as the official animal shelter for ~~both rural and urban areas of Madison County~~ for the City.

(E) ~~The daily cost of operation of the shelter and the collection of dogs by the dog wardens shall be shared on a percentage basis as follows: 65% by Madison County Fiscal Court, 25% by the City Commission, and 10% by Berea City Council, of all expenses not covered by monies received from fees, licensing, redemptions, costs and sales, and by donations through the Madison County Humane Society. The City, through budgeted appropriations made in fiscal year budgets, shall appropriate such monies for the use and benefit of the Madison County Humane Society and the Madison County Animal Shelter as the Board of Commissioners, in the exercise of its sole discretion, shall from time to time deem appropriate.~~

SECTION III

This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its enactment by the Board of Commissioners following second reading, and publication in accordance with the requirements of applicable Kentucky law.



ORDINANCE NO. 20-13

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF RICHMOND, KENTUCKY AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 76-26
WITH RESPECT TO CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF CHAPTER 90 OF THE CITY OF RICHMOND,
KENTUCKY CODE OF ORDINANCES**

By Ordinance No. 20-13, the Board of Commissioners for the City of Richmond, Kentucky amended certain provisions of Chapter 90 of the City of Richmond, Kentucky Code of Ordinances relating to the Madison County Animal Shelter and the City's use and support of that facility. The Ordinance as amended: (i) permits the City, in lieu of the Madison County Fiscal Court, to designate an animal shelter other than the Madison County Animal Shelter for City impoundment purposes; (ii) permits the City to designate a shelter other than the Madison County Animal Shelter as an official animal shelter for use by the City; and (iii) provides that the City, in future fiscal years, shall appropriate monies for the use and benefit of the Madison County Humane Society and the Madison County Animal Shelter in such amounts as the Board of Commissioners, in the sole exercise of its discretion, may deem appropriate.


